Professor Wolcott is the Founder & Executive Director of the Kellogg Innovation Network (KIN) and a member of the MBA and EMBA faculty at the Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University. He holds appointments with both the Center for Research in Technology & Innovation (CRTI) and the Levy Institute for Entrepreneurial Practice at the Kellogg School. He teaches corporate innovation and entrepreneurship in Evanston and for Kellogg's Executive MBA Programs in Hong Kong (with HKUST) and Miami. In 2002 and 2005, he served as Visiting Professor at the Keio Business School (Tokyo).

Wolcott's most recent article, *Four Models of Corporate Entrepreneurship*, with collaborator Dr. Michael J. Lippitz, appeared in the Fall 2007 issue of the MIT Sloan Management Review. He and Dr. Lippitz are working on a book under contract with McGraw-Hill on the same subject for release in Fall 2009. His article with Professors Mohan Sawhney and Inigo Arroniz, *Twelve Different Ways for Companies to Innovate*, was selected in 2007 by the editors of the MIT Sloan Management Review as one of the top 20 innovation articles of the past 20 years. The Innovation Radar, the subject of the article, was recently selected by the Nordic Council of Ministers as a standard for measuring and promoting innovation throughout Nordic countries. His work has been cited in *Business Week*, *Financial Times* and *New York Times*.

In 2003, Wolcott founded the **Kellogg Innovation Network (KIN)**, a network of senior executives dedicated to driving sustainable innovation. Members include Cargill, Cisco, PepsiCo, IBM, DuPont, FedEx, Chamberlain Group, Microsoft, Motorola and SC Johnson, among others. On June 1 - 3, 2009, Wolcott will lead the first KIN Global Summit at Kellogg: *Building Global Prosperity: Innovation & Action*. The Summit will convene 200 business, government and academic leaders to explore the role of innovation in solving the global challenges of the 21st century.

Wolcott also co-founded and serves as Managing Partner of Clareo Partners, LLC, a corporate strategy and innovation management consultancy specializing in new business creation and growth strategies (www.clareopartners.com). Clients include Kraft, Raytheon, SC Johnson, Alticor, Microsoft, Tyco/ADT, Herman Miller, HP, Chamberlain, Ricoh, Rio Tinto and SAP.
